## **Marina del Rey**

Marina del Rey has long been overshadowed by its funky famous neighbor Venice, but this seaside community boasts myriad opportunities for water sports, gourmet dining, and hip hotel stays. So, while L.A.'s better-known locales might draw more crowds, those in the know fancy this breezy waterfront 'hood as well.
